First Match	Played at the Royal Navel Field Somerset June 12th 1902
	East End Games were played at Garrison Field until Wellington Oval opened in 1921
	First Game at Somerset Cricket Club venue was 1949
First Admission	Fans were not charged admission until the mid - 1920's
The Games First Duck	William Bassett of Somerset 1902, Bassett was also the first to bag a pair as he was run out in the 2nd inning
First Cup Match on Turf Wicket	Played at the Somerset Cricket Club in 1971 and St. George's followed suit in 1972.
Youngest Players	Tre Govia - St. George's Cricket Club 2008 - Joshua Gilbert - Somerset Cricket Club 2009
Longest Cup Match Career	Alec Steede 1922 - 1951
Most Successful Captain	St. George's Calvin Symonds won eight Cup Matches and drew one from 1961 - 1969
Best Bowling Performance	Clarence Parfitt claimed 9-47 in 1976
Wicket on the First Ball	In the 1953 Cup Match Kenneth Smith from St. George's had Wilfred Wilson caught by Calvin Symonds
Six on the First Ball	In the 2002 Cup Match Glenn Blakeney from St. George's hit Corey Hill up against the Somerset Cricket Club
Most Centuries	3 - Clay Smith St. George's
Biggest Win	In 1926 St. George's Won by an Innings and 65 runs
Narrowest Win	Somerset won by 10 runs in 1924
Lowest Score	Somerset scored 24 runs in 1902
Most Consecutive Wins	6 Somerset (1914 - 1919), 6 St. George's (1964 - 1969)
Longest Reign as Cup Holders	19 Years St. George's (1960 - 1979)
Highest Individual Score	186 Runs - Janeiro Tucker
